## "ED" ENDINGS

FIND THE FIRST PART OF THE WORD. EXAMPLES:

KICKED FIND "KICK."

**ROARED** FIND "ROAR."

WHEN THE FIRST PART OF THE WORD ENDS IN

T or D

PRONOUNCE "ED" LIKE "ID".

## EXAMPLES:

LANDED sounds like "LANDID." PLANTED sounds like "PLANTID."

WHEN THE FIRST PART OF THE WORD ENDS IN, OR SOUNDS LIKE IT ENDS IN, K, S, CH, SH, F, P, TH

PRONOUNCE "ED" LIKE "T".

EXAMPLES:

KICKED sounds like "KIKT." LAUGHED sounds like "LAFT."

FOR ALL OTHER ENDING SOUNDS, PRONOUNCE "ED" LIKE "D."

**EXAMPLES:** 

ROARED sounds like "RORD." PLAYED sounds like "PLAYD."

## THE FOLLOWING WORDS ARE EXCEPTIONS TO THE RULES. IN THESE WORDS, THE "ED" SOUNDS LIKE "ID" OR "ED."
