


Chapter 14 More Interviews



Lincoln Memorial

Read about the Lincoln Memorial. Then answer the questions below.

The Lincoln Memorial honors Abraham Lincoln, the sixteenth President of the United States. The memorial, designed by Henry Bacon, was modeled after ancient Greek temples. The building contains a marble sculpture of Lincoln that is 19 feet high and weighs 175 tons. It also contains inscriptions of Lincoln's famous speeches, including his Gettysburg Address. The Lincoln Memorial is the place where Martin Luther King, Jr., delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech in 1963.
